

Paid Positions at the Office of Sustainability


The Office of Sustainability is <u>hiring right now</u> for internship positions! Interested students should not delay applications, as positions will be hired on a rolling basis, with a strong interest in filling the positions within the next 2 weeks.

- A position just opened up for their waste initiatives team this role would help with Circularity Center sales and promotion, our reusable period products program, and the reusable dishes event loan program (among other initiatives).
- The Office of Sustainability has 2 communications positions (social media, newsletter articles, coms strategy and more!).
- There are also several positions in energy & emissions (Carbon Neutrality and Renewable Energy).

The Office of Sustainability was recently named as a partner in the <u>Campus Climate Action Corps</u> (an Americorps program), and are hiring for 6 "minimum time" (part time) positions.

- These positions receive a stipend equivalent to the hourly wages of our internships PLUS a financial educational award good for 7 years.
- The position includes some training by Americorps and also the federal fingerprinting and background checks
- Focal areas are energy, biodiversity, and circularity/solid waste mitigation
