addition, I can also work with you to develop SMART goals so that you can measure progress along the way.


No matter how big or small your need is, don't hesitate to reach out for assistance. We are here throughout your academic journey.



TRIO Student Support Services


The TRIO program provides support to undergraduate scholars that identify as
